## **GUIDANCE DOCUMENT No 11**

## ON THE APPLICATION OF DIRECTIVE 2009/48/EC ON THE SAFETY OF TOYS

## Toys intended for children under 36 months of age or of 36 months and over

This Guidance document is a non-binding document intended to provide guidelines to help Member States and stakeholders on the classification of toys intended for children under 36 months of age or of 36 months and over. The proposals in this document are not necessarily supported by all the experts in the Expert Group on Toy Safety. However, on the whole the document reflects the general approach of the Expert Group regarding the classification of toys intended for children under 36 months of age or of 36 months and over. The images appearing in the document constitute examples intended to facilitate the decision-making. They do not presuppose the conformity of the represented products 1.

This Guidance document does not relieve national authorities from their obligation to determine for any individual product, on a case-by-case basis, whether it falls within the scope of application of the Toy Safety Directive 2009/48/EC or within the scope of application of other sectoral legislation. The Court of Justice of the European Union has repeatedly held that the national authorities, acting under the supervision of the courts, must proceed on a case-by-case basis, taking account of all the characteristics of the product. Therefore, this document shall not "prescribe" which regulatory framework applies. Rather, it shall serve as one out of many elements supporting the national competent authorities in their case-by-case decision on individual products. In particular, this Guidance document does not prevent a national authority from consulting with colleagues from other regulated sectors concerned in order to reach a complete view on all aspects related to a given product.

This guidance document (including its classification criteria) is not meant to affect products already placed on the market before the revised document has been published on the Europa website.

## Toys intended for children under 36 months of age or of 36 months and over

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

The Commission services asked the Member State experts on toy safety to reflect upon the criteria to be chosen in defining toys intended for children under or above 36 months of age.

The French authorities presented a comprehensive document on the classification of toys intended for children under or above 36 months of age. On the basis of the French authorities' reflections and the contributions from the Member State experts, the Expert Group on Toy Safety adopted the first version of this Guidance document in 2009. This first version focused on three categories of toys: jigsaw puzzles, dolls, and soft and stuffed toys.

In the meanwhile many new kinds of toys were developed and introduced on the European market. During the years a lot of disputes were reported because manufacturers and authorities had classified toys differently or because of different opinions between the member states regarding the correct age classification.

Therefore member state authorities as well as manufacturers and stakeholders asked for a revision of Guidance document No 11. On the basis of the draft document made by the ADCO Working group "Guide No 11" and the contributions from the Member State experts, the Expert Group on Toy Safety adopted the new version in 2023.

The CEN report CR 14379 "Classification of toys – Guidelines", which was the main background document for the old version, has been withdrawn in 2016.

CEN ISO/TR 8124-8:2016 Safety of toys - Part 8: Age determination guidelines are taken into account in the new version.

CEN ISO/TR 8124-8:2016 provides guidelines for the determination of the lowest age at which children start playing with toys in specific toy-categories. When a starting age is mentioned for specific categories of toys, it doesn't mean that all the toys belonging to that category must be classified as suitable for that age. Number of pieces, dimensions, level of detail and realism, special functions of the specific toy may change/increase the intended age.

Guidance Document No 11 is only intended to help in classifying toys as intended for children under or above 36 months of age. More detailed age determination as proposed in CEN ISO/TR 8124-8:2016 is not considered in this guideline.

The new version of this Guidance document No 11 includes a wider range of toy categories. In addition to dolls, soft and stuffed toys, puzzles, there are twelve more categories (see above: table of content, chapter 4. Product categories).

Toy categories for which specific guidelines are already available are not included, whether or not a distinction is made according to age groups in the current versions: concerns scooters (No 1), toys used in and on the water (No 7), pools (No 8), books (No 9), musical instruments (No 10), crafts (No 13), sports equipment (No 14), writing instruments and stationary (No 15), electronic equipment ( such as personal computers and

game consoles) (No 16), disguise costumes (No 17), puffer balls and puffer toys (No 18), soother holder (No 19), decorative products and products for collectors (No 20). See <u>https://ec.europa.eu/growth/sectors/toys/toy-safety/guidance\_en</u>.

Toy categories which are clearly intended for children 3 years and older are also not included (for example chemical experimental sets).

#### 2. LEGAL BACKGROUND

Article 2 of the Toy Safety Directive 2009/48/EC defines toys as "products designed or intended, whether or not exclusively, for use in play by children under 14 years of age".

The Directive does not provide requirements regarding the different age classification grades. However, it acknowledges that children under 36 months of age are especially at risk because of their mouthing behaviour and their undeveloped or limited physical and mental maturity. Consequently, the Directive sets out particular stringent provisions for toys intended for those children.

Article 10 (2) of the Directive provides that "Toys, including the chemicals they contain, shall not jeopardise the safety or health of users or third parties when they are used as intended or in a foreseeable way, bearing in mind the behaviour of children." and "The ability of the users and, where appropriate, their supervisors shall be taken into account, in particular, in the case of toys which are intended for use by children under 36 months or by other specified age groups." An explanation of the intended versus reasonably foreseeable use of the toy is provided in the Explanatory Guidance Document on the Toy safety Directive Rev 1.10.

Annex II Part I point 4 (d) provides that "Toys, which are clearly intended for use by children under 36 months, and their component parts and any of their detachable parts must be of such dimensions as to prevent their being swallowed or inhaled."

For toys which might be dangerous for children under 36 months of age Annex V Part B point 1 of the Directive requires that they must bear a warning, such as "Not suitable for children under 36 months" or "Not suitable for children under three years". The warning must be accompanied by a brief indication, which may appear in the instructions for use, of the specific hazard calling for this precaution. The warning can be replaced by the graphic shown in Annex V Part B point 1.

However, the obligation to affix the warning does not apply to toys which, on account of their function, dimensions, characteristics or properties, or on other cogent grounds, are manifestly unsuitable for children under 36 months of age.

On the other hand according to Article 11 (1) of the TSD "Toys shall not bear one or more of the specific warnings set out in Part B of Annex V where that warning conflicts with the intended use of the toy, as determined by virtue of its function, dimension and characteristics".

## **3.** CRITERIA FOR THE CLASSIFICATION OF TOYS INTENDED FOR CHILDREN UNDER **36** MONTHS OF AGE

Toys could be designed in a such a way that some of their characteristics may appeal to children under 36 months of age while other characteristics may appeal to children above that age. In fact, the borderline between toys intended for children under and above 36 months of age is not always clear and easy to determine. In order to clearly identify the borderline some key factors were identified by the Expert Group on Toy Safety.

The distinction between toys for babies (up to 10 months) and toys for children 3 years and older is usually easy. Rattle-shaped toys and squeeze toys are usually clearly classified as toys for children under 3 years of age. Therefore it does not seem necessary to describe this toy category in more detail in a separate annex. Guidance document No 11 is intended to provide help to distinguish between toys for "< 3" and "3+". However, it is not the aim of this guidance document to determine whether toys are to be classified as toys intended for children who are too young to sit up unaided.

The play value of a toy intended for children under 36 months could be determined by the following key factors, e.g.:

- (1) the psychology of children of under 3 years, particularly their need to "cuddle";
- (2) their attraction to objects "which are like them": baby, small child, baby animal, etc.;
- (3) their preference to imitate adults and their activities;
- (4) their mental development, particularly their lack of capacity for abstraction, low level of knowledge, limited patience, etc.;
- (5) their less developed physical abilities in terms of ease of movement, manual dexterity, etc. (the toy may be small and light for the child to handle it easily).

Some considerations have to be made:

- (1) It is the children's aptitudes to use a toy in accordance with its destination which justify the choice to intend them for children under or above 36 months of age; if this use can start before 36 months of age and continue thereafter, the toy has to be appropriate for children under 36 months of age;
- (2) If a toy involves small parts that can be swallowed or inhaled or if there is a risk of strangulation, this does not mean, *ipso facto*, that the toy is intended for children above 36 months of age;
- (3) Warnings on a toy such as "Not suitable for children under 36 months" or "Not suitable for children under three years" or the warning graphic referred to above must not be used as a justification to claim that a toy is for children above 36 months of age and incorrectly apply less demanding tests for such toys in order to 'demonstrate' conformity. The aforementioned warnings must therefore not be present on toys that meet the criteria for under 36 months of age while at the same time presenting risks for children of that age.

In the case of surprise packages the age classification always depends on the toy which is inside the package.

Please note that the size and weight indications provided next to the images shown in the following annexes serve to better describe the examples shown. This does not mean that they are to be considered as final classification criteria.

#### 4. **PRODUCT CATEGORIES**

#### Annex 1 Puzzles

Children like playing with puzzles. Puzzles exist in various types and styles. In general, children starting at 12 months can play with puzzles depending of the type/style of puzzle. Puzzles require three major skills: the fine motor skill to take and place the pieces, the visual skills to identify if the pieces fit, and the cognitive skill to plan the placing of pieces.

Criteria that are important in determining the suitability of the puzzle for a particular age category are:

- number of the pieces;
- size of the pieces;
- theme / details of drawing;
- interlocking or loose pieces.

Children starting at the age of 19 months are interested in putting together objects that fit. Their play game is based on trial and error and they are not able to use strategies for completing puzzles. At around 2 years of age children begin to recognize puzzle shapes and angles and are able to fit a piece of a certain shape in a well with the same shape.

#### Criteria for classification "< 3":

- large pieces;
- small amount of pieces that shall be connected in a specific order: up to around 10 pieces (for interlocking parts) or up to about 20 pieces (without interlocking parts)
- puzzles with simple frames;
- puzzles with easy to grip knobs;
- interlocking foam mats;
- large recognizable wells in certain shapes, like animals, vehicles;
- inset- and other fit-in type puzzles;
- puzzles pieces with smooth edges, which fit together without interlocking;
- pieces are interchangeable, can be placed randomly (similar shape, standard and identical indents);
- pieces can be interconnected at random, in no particular order (in this case the number of pieces can be higher);

#### Criteria for classification "3+":

- puzzles with around 10 or more interlocking parts;
- puzzles that have different indents and can only be put together in one way in order to create a pre-designed shape or picture;
- 3-D puzzle;

#### Annex 2 Dolls

Dolls can resemble a baby, a child, an adolescent or an adult and be either male or female or diverse. Dolls account for a very broad and diverse segment of the toy market, reflecting their design, level of realism and, in some cases, their accompanying accessories.

#### • Dolls sold alone

Criteria for classification "< 3"

- simple design;
- lightweight dolls, neither very small nor very big (easy to hold)
- flexible, soft, smooth, cuddly products which resemble babies or little children;
- made entirely from padded fabric (examples 1 3);
- bodies made completely from padded fabric, but with head and limbs made from rubber or PVC, or even totally made from rubber or PVC (examples 4 6);
- head and limbs which can be moved only very slightly
- simple actions which make the doll move, cry or talk (pulling a cord, pressing a button, etc.);
- with little or no interaction.
- <u>Non-determining factors (factors which should not be taken into account for age classification "<3" or "3+"):</u>
  - hair, made from wool or imitation hair;
  - eyes which close
- Baby dolls and dolls sold with associated accessories

#### • Consumer packaging should be designed for children under 3 years old

In addition to the doll with the accessories mentioned above, the consumer packaging may include the following accessories:

- non-removable clothes which the doll is already wearing;
- clothes which are easy to put on and take off, do not need adjustment, and are already worn by the doll or included as spare clothes;
- objects which are associated with children under 3 years old and which reflect their capabilities (potty, bib, plate, spoon, combs, etc).

# • Consumer packaging not intended for children under 3 years old but contain a doll suitable to this age group

If the doll meets the requirement summarized under sub-heading **Dolls sold alone** (see *above*), it should be suitable for children under 3 years old. Children under 3 years old should only be barred from access to the toy on the basis of the clothes worn by the doll, or placed in the consumer packaging, and / or to its associated accessories:

- clothes which are difficult to adjust, button or put on, etc;
- shoes with straps or laces, etc;
- more elaborate accessories, for example, a backpack, small scooter, rollerblades, small furniture items, buggy, hair bands, etc.

### • Dolls not intended for children under 3 years old

#### Criteria for classification "3+"

This category refers to dolls with which children do not identify themselves as "dad", "mum", "big brother", "big sister". Examples include:

- traditional dolls which are completely rigid, those with many joints, dolls which you can dress, do their hair, etc.;
- fashion dolls, for example dolls and their accessories as shown in example 8-10

## Annex 3 Soft and stuffed or partially stuffed toys

In this Annex soft toys are considered as well as soft stuffed and partially soft stuffed toys. No distinction is made between the wording "soft stuffed" and "soft filled". "Filled" can be set for "stuffed" and the other way round.

Soft toys, by their nature, are cuddly toys due to their light, soft, spongy and smooth qualities. Very young infants have indeed a natural instinct to cuddle or be cuddled. Soft toys normally appear as baby animals or cartoon heroes. These are the kind of toys which attract very young infants and with which children instinctively identify themselves.

They encourage basic playing, not requiring any special learning. The toy acts as a companion for the child and they look upon it as a living person, carrying it around with them and taking it to bed, etc.

There are many soft toys available on the market which are actually designed or clearly intended for use in play by children under 36 months of age, or objects where, based on the reasons mentioned above, it would be reasonable to assume their use as toys for children under 36 months of age.

In nearly all cases, soft toys should be suitable for children under 36 months of age. While exceptions arising from a particular design of toy do exist, these are rare and reflect additional features which may hinder the child's ability to cuddle the toy; the toy would therefore be regarded as being suitable for children over 36 months of age.

For toys with sequins see also Note from the ADCO Group to "<u>Soft-filled toys with sequins</u> - 6 March 2019"<sup>2</sup>.

Examples of soft toys which should be considered as intended for children under 36 months of age are as follows:

### • Soft and stuffed or partially stuffed toys (see <u>Table 1</u>)

There are soft toys which are stuffed, partially stuffed or not stuffed (soft filled). The toys can have a dual function like soft toys attached to a key ring, animal shaped cushions, purses, backpacks, animal shaped water bottle cover, hair ribbon etc.

#### • Squishies (see <u>Table 2</u>)

Squishy toys consists of soft material like foam or silicon. After being squeezed, they return to its original shape. They are produced in many different sizes and shapes, such as play figures, animals, fruits or other food items. There are also squishy toys where the foam is covered with textile.

Squishy products are also offered as anti-stress products or anti-stress toys. Nevertheless these products shall comply with the Toy Safety Directive 2009/48/EC if they are designed or intended - whether or not exclusively - for use in play by children. In addition, they must meet the stricter requirements on toys for children under 3 years, if the toys are intended or foreseeable for this age group.

Note:

For products which could be confused with foodstuffs see Council Directive 87/357/EEC of 25 June 1987 on the approximation of the laws of the Member States concerning products which, appearing to be other than they are, endanger the health or safety of consumers.

#### Criteria for classification "< 3":

- Simple, robust design
- low degree of realistic detail
- Lightweight, soft, smooth, cuddly
- bright, vibrant or contrasting colours
- less features,
- little interaction

#### Criteria for classification "3+":

- More realistic details
- Too large, heavy, unwieldy
- Higher motor skills required
- Many complex functions

### Annex 4 Fidget toys

Fidget toys were originally designed to people who need to move in order to be able to concentrate, learn and be calm. Later they have become a toy desirable for all children. Fidget is usually a rather small object that can be squeezed, pulled, popped or moved around. For example squishies presented in Annex 3 (Table 2) can be used as fidgets, and also puffer figures which are discussed more closely in Guidance document No. 18 on puffer balls and similar toys.

"Pop it's" are thick rubber plates which have bobbles that can be pushed from side to side. They can be used as such or as a game where players take turns pressing down any number of bubbles they wish in a single row. If the plate is not clearly a game, then it is considered to be meant for children under 36 months old.

# Annex 5 Modelling clay/dough, slime, soap bubbles

Children under 36 months like materials to mould and knead. They love the texture of materials and will use their hands to handle materials whenever possible. The process of creating art is more important to them then the final product, they use the material for manipulation instead of trying to make a specific shape using a mold. They also are able to play in sand with simple sand molds, shovels and sand buckets.

Furthermore children like to watch soap bubbles, they try to catch them and enjoy to see them pop. Some of the children already try to blow bubbles themselves.

Children aged 36 months and up begin to use clay and similar materials with molds to make shape and use it for early sculpting activities. Their fine motor skills are already further developed. They can manipulate clay and modeling dough, use craft sticks and plastic tools for the clay. They can also manage to play with liquid materials. They like slime and slimy products and are able to use tools for blowing soap bubbles correctly.

If modelling clay is sold as a set with tools (like a simple non-sharp knife, press, cutter, rolling pin), the basic material (modelling clay) still has to be suitable for children under 36 months.

# Annex 6 Movable/wheeled toys

Children under 36 month like miniature models of simple figures with low details and little vehicles which can be pushed. They use them for things like exploration, imitations by watching adults and pretend play.

Commonly, they like toys which are easy grasping and pushing with low degree of short cause and effect, for example direct movement, pull/push - make noise or pull/push - simple movements. Also multisensoric elements are attractive.

Between 8 and 12 month, children begin to train their fine motor skills with actions like grasping, pulling, pushing and stroking.

At the age of about 2, they can also manage simple screwing actions and a simple windup mechanism with low tension.

Children aged 36 months and up like mechanical and electrical vehicles which copy vehicles for adults. These vehicles are proportioned and have more details than toys for children under 36 months, realistic details like loose parts, decorations and printed words. They also may produce sounds, lights or talking.

### Annex 7 Play scenes, constructed models and construction toys

Children round 19 month of age start to be interested in blocks and interlocking building materials. Before that age, such materials are only be used as grasping objects. They are now able to stack blocks, can do simple assembly work and are amused in pull down their buildings.

Children under 36 month begin to engage in building play. They like simply handling objects and materials and use them for constructing or assorting. They like miniature models of simple figures with low details and bright colours and which are easy grasping and pushing. They use them for things like exploration, imitations by watching adults and pretend play.

Children aged 36 months and up have the fine motor skills to play more complex and to combine smaller pieces, their constructions become more advanced. They like more realistic looking (e.g. miniature people, model trees) and are able to build large simple tracks with easy connection. They are able to see the relationship between parts and can tell in advance if two parts will fit together just by looking at the parts - that means they often know if two parts will fit together, before they have actually tried putting them together. Now, they are able to work with connecting mechanism like snapping, screwing or pressing together. They explore the cause and effect of a moved car and watch it travel down a slope and the rate of speed.

# Annex 8 Game sets and board games

Typically, game sets and board games start with games for 2 year old children and up. Below that age, the development of the cognitive and motor skills is neither perfected enough to take part nor they have the attention span required to participate. Game sets and Board games for children at this age are about simple matching or differentiation like lottotype games, in which the matching is based on pictures, shapes or colours. One other child or an adult may be involved, or also the game is explored alone.

Games sets and Board games for children aged 36 months and up have more parts and rules. Still, they do not understand game strategy. Suitable games are based on chance, a game with no final winner or loser is preferred. They enjoy matching a memory games as well as active movement games and cooperative games. They start to recognize simple letters and numbers.

Parts, rules and also needed time increase with increasing age.

# Annex 9 Toys intended to be entered

Children between 18 and 36 month start to be interested in role play. They like toys which can be used to play "house/home", toys which form an enclosed chamber to enter. Still they like low details and bright colours.

In some cases, toys intended to be entered by a child can also be used from children under 18 month, e.g. with simple accessories this age group appealing like simple balls, mobiles or stuffed toys

If toys intended to be entered by a child have realistic activities or are representing an adult subject, they can also be classified for children aged 36 months and up.

## Annex 10 Toys intended to bear the mass of a child

Toys intended to bear the mass of a child can vary a lot in design and can be all from plastic horses to ride on for toddlers to toy bicycles for children over 3 years.

For children under 3 years those toys require a lower level of coordination and balance. The child can stabilize on the toy by using the feet on the ground.

Toys for older children contain an extra feature, such as pedals which require the child to have a higher level of balance and coordination, since the feet are not used to stabilize anymore.

An under 3 classification does not mean that the toy cannot be anymore used when the child has reached the age of 3 years and over. However, the requirements of EN 71-1 on the maximum body weight of the child should be applied.

#### Criteria for classification "< 3"

- Child can stabilize the toy by using feet.
- More than two wheels/legs so that the toy can be easily balanced
- No extra features such as pedals

- Extra skill required, such as using the pedals to move forward, balance and stabilize the toy, breaks system that is operated from the handle etc.
- 2 wheels/legs with no extra stabilizer, which requires the child to have a high level of balance
- Toy is not stabilized by itself anymore

# Annex 11 Toy sports equipment and balls

Toy versions of sports equipment are mainly aimed at children over 36 months. With increasing dexterity and understanding of game rules, older children can handle more complex toy sports equipment and perform more challenging games. Children under 3 years of age imitate sports activities only playfully, without following rules.

Balls are available in different types and sizes and are very appealing to children under 36 months. They can be rolled, thrown and caught, encouraging eye-hand coordination and the child's agility. Balls for elder children are often heavier and/or not so easy to throw or have a rougher surface.

# Annex 13 Push-pull toys and pull-along toys

## Push-pull toys

Children under 36 months like to use push-pull toys to develop their gross motor skills, commonly using them to take their first steps as they are pushing and pulling the toy around as they provide stability. These toys commonly help children around 12 months and up to stabilize while walking and are therefore designed in a simple way that children can hold on to. They commonly are of simple design with wheels.

Children aged 36 months and up like push-pull toys that imitate/copy devices used by adults. These push toys are more detailed and resemble real devices.

### **Pull-along toys**

Younger children under 36 months love pull-along toys in the shape of animals that they can pull along on a string. These toys not only train fine motor skills by picking up the string, but also help to learn about the concept of cause and effect.

Pull along toys for children over 36 months are heavier and often not constructed in the form of colourful animals, but rather sledges or wagons.

### Annex 14 Audio/Visual Equipment

Children relate differently to audiovisual devices. While babies prefer soft, gentle and rhythmic sounds or voices, by getting older children develop more and more an urge to move from simple sounds and stories to more complex ones.

The cognitive abilities of the children also change. Children are increasingly interested in computer-based toys and interactive play, and enjoy exploring the cause-and-effect relationships. With increasing age they are also capable of operating devices with multiple buttons and more complex functions.

- simple songs and stories

### Annex 15 Toy figures and other toys

In the case of figures the following factors should be considered:

- Psychology of children of under 3 years, particularly their need to "cuddle": these toys cannot be hugged, so most of them would not meet this requirement. (However it could be considered a positive answer if the toy is "sweet", "cute" or "lovely", and he awakens the instinct to embrace).

- Attraction to objects "which are like them": baby, small child, baby animal, etc: cartoon characters and superheroes especially if they are on TV are considered also attractive.

- Mental development: Children with start ages from 24-36 months do like role-playing, recognise names of fictional characters, have enough dexterity to grab small figures. The purpose of the game is simple, adapted to children under 36 months.

- Physical abilities (the toy may be small and light for the child to handle it easily): If it is made of plastic or rubber they can be considered light enough.

Criteria for classification "< 3":

- Simple, robust design (e.g. rigid piece of rubber or plastic)

- low degree of realistic detail (When talking about real characters/animals it is easier to distinguish realistic features, but when it comes to TV or comic cartoons the level of detail is very ambiguous. However, it can be considered a low level of detail if the smallest details are not well differentiated or coloured, the features of the face are not detailed (without very realistic factions, hair, wrinkles or expressions), their clothes does not have folds and shadows, hands and/or fingers are not detailed.

- not realistic colours (however, depending on the figures, realistic colours can also be attractive for children <3

- simple game that does not require the child to have fine motor skills, and coordination or play with it in a complex specific way,

- no articulations not actuated by small buttons or levers, or very simple articulations: hips (no knees), head (only turn around), arms (from shoulder, no elbows)

- no sophisticated accessories, shooting projectiles,

- does not need fine motor skills for the assembling
